OUR MISSION

When a parent is seriously injured or killed at work, a child's future shouldn't have to change.

Kids' Chance of Florida is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to helping the children of Florida workers who have been seriously or fatally injured in workplace accidents pursue higher education and career goals.

We provide scholarships and educational support that help turn a family's unexpected hardship into a child's opportunity for a brighter future.

OUR IMPACT

Since 2015, Kids' Chance of Florida has:

- **125 scholarships awarded** to Florida scholars
- **\$525,000+ invested** in educational opportunities
- **\$4,000 average annual scholarship** award
- **Nearly \$350,000 in reserves** dedicated to supporting current scholars throughout their educational journey
- **20 students supported in the most recent scholarship cycle**, with more than **\$70,000 awarded**
- Supported students pursuing **two- and four-year degrees, technical education, vocational training, certificates and licenses**
- Built a growing network of donors, sponsors, volunteers and advocates committed to changing the trajectory of children affected by workplace injuries

THE NEED IS GREATER THAN TUITION

When a parent suffers a catastrophic workplace injury or death, the financial impact can be immediate and long-lasting. College savings may disappear. Household income can change. A child's educational plans can suddenly feel out of reach.

Kids' Chance steps in to help keep those dreams alive.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Scholarships are awarded annually to eligible dependent children of workers who have been seriously injured or killed in a compensable workplace injury.

Awards typically range from **\$2,000 to \$10,000 per academic year**, based on available funding and individual circumstances. Students must reapply annually to be considered for continued support.

Scholarships may be used toward eligible postsecondary education, including colleges, universities, technical schools and vocational programs.

WHO WE SERVE

Eligible students generally must:

- Be a dependent child of a Florida worker who was seriously or fatally injured in a workplace-related accident
- Be pursuing an eligible postsecondary education or training program
- Demonstrate satisfactory academic progress
- Demonstrate financial need and meet program eligibility requirements

Every application is reviewed through a competitive process and final awards are approved by the Kids' Chance of Florida Board of Directors.
